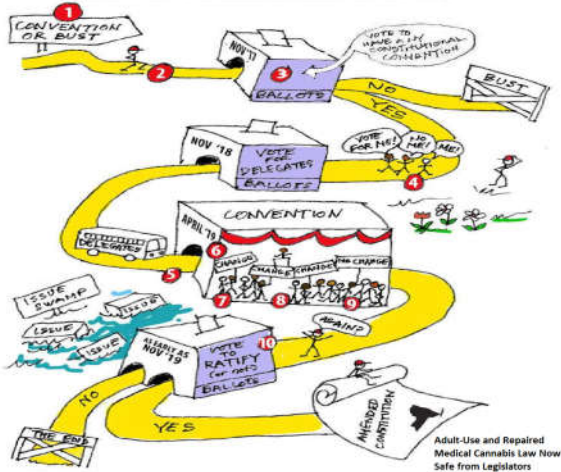

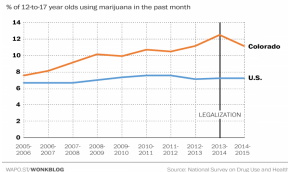

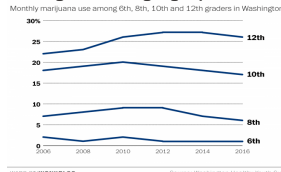

Washington kids not going to pot

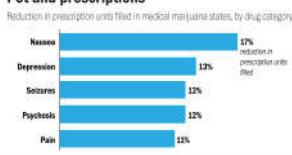

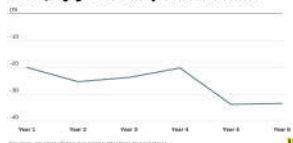
